Elder James J. Hamula:


"Wisdom is the capacity to exercise sound judgment in applying general knowledge and principles to particular circumstances. Thus it consists of both a broad knowledge and understanding of things and the judgment to apply that knowledge properly. Without broad knowledge there cannot be wisdom. . . . Solomon recognized that something more was required for him to properly perform his duties. . . . essentially a gift of the Spirit." ("The Quest for Wisdom," *Ensign*, July 2002, 40)

"And he reigned for 40 years"—A phrase used frequently about Solomon's time on back through biblical history, probably not meant to be literal, but rather "a long time," or "a generation." After Solomon's reign, kingship spans thereafter began to be measured more by historical evidence than metaphor.

3 Modern Temples Modeled After Solomon's Temple

Supporting no towers or spires, these 3 temples resemble Solomon's temple of old:

- Laie, Hawaii (Top L)
- Cardston, Alberta (Bottom L)
- Mesa, Arizona (Bottom R)
